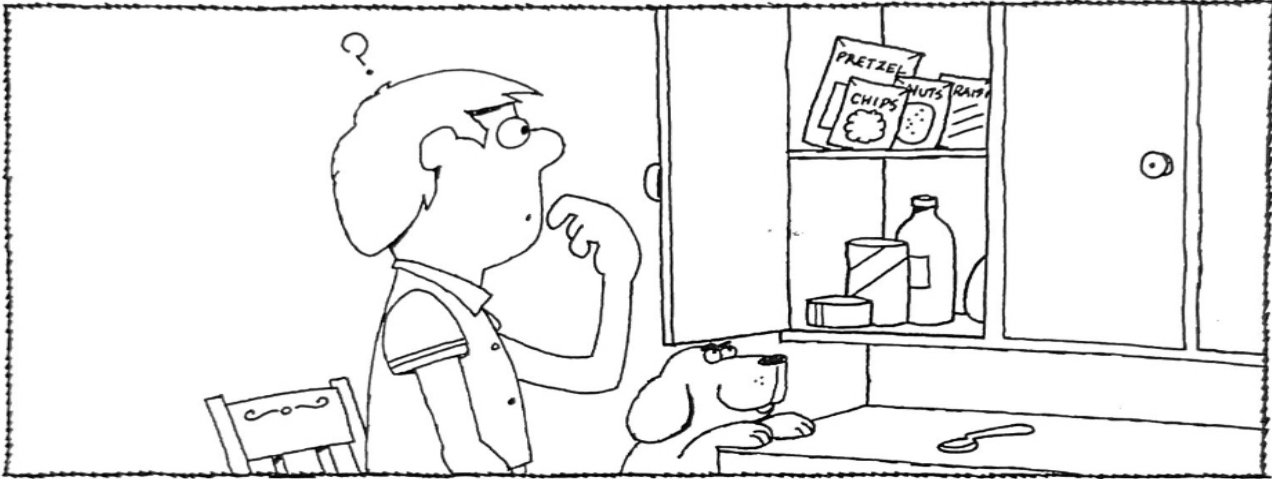


A SNACK A DAY
