## Fraud Alert

Facebook Marketplace can be a great place to find gently used items such as; clothing, furniture, and other household items. It is also a place where landlords will sometimes list apartments or homes available for rent. However, it is far to common that it is a place where scammers and con artists take advantage of those unaware of their tactics. A common scam that many have fallen prey to is when someone will copy a legitimate listing and post it as their own with their own contact information included. When you send them a message or inquire about the listing, they will ask for payment to "hold the item" because they have received so much interest in the listing. Avoid falling for this trap and DO NOT put money down on any item (listing) sight unseen. Often, the money is accepted and the listing is removed and the phone number no longer works and you never receive the item you believe you "reserved". A second common scam to be aware of is, there are many who will ask for money in order to visit a potential home or apartment listed for rent. Any legitimate landlord will not ask for money to visit a property, if they do, it's most likely a scam.

Here are several tips to help you avoid scams on Facebook Marketplace:

1. Make arrangements to pick up an item in a neutral location that is a public space and surrounded by people and businesses.
2. Bring someone with you, do not go alone and let someone know where you are going.
3. Pay cash only once you have received the item.
4. When looking for rental property, make an appointment, take someone with you and never pay money before the visit.




